**Title:** Found Objects

**Drop-off Dates:** Oct 20–24 during Gallery hours. Deadline: Oct 24, 2010

**Media:** Any 2D or 3D media, maximum size for 2D work is 4x4 ft.

## Description:

**Show:** “Found Objects” is a unique show for artists using found objects in an interesting or unique way in their work. Submission is open to all artists within the guidelines listed below. The show will be held in the Main Gallery.

**Venue:** Gallery X is a contemporary, cooperative art gallery and performance space in downtown New Bedford Ma. A wide variety of visual and performing arts are presented in the two galleries in the former 1855 First Universalist Church building. The gallery tries to present a mix of established and emerging artists through a wide range of shows both by its members and by outside artists.

## Submission details:

**Price:** \$35 for up to 3 works. \$15/piece for single or additional pieces (Make checks payable to Gallery X). The fee is non-refundable and does not guarantee the work will be selected for hanging in the show. Final selection will be made by the juror. Gallery X is not responsible for work that may be damaged in Gallery before, during, or after commencement of exhibition.

**Dates:** Work may be submitted between Oct 20 and Oct 24, 2010. Work may be delivered during gallery hours (Wed. - Fri. 11 to 5PM & Sat. & Sun. 11 AM to 3 PM). Work may be shipped to the gallery but it MUST include paid return postage if you don't plan to pick it up. To be included in the show, work must be ready to hang (properly wired, no saw teeth) for display.

Show runs from 10/27/2010 to 11/27/2010 with an opening reception on Sat. Oct. 30 from 7 – 10pm

## Juror:

Julia Pavone

Julia Pavone is the co-founder and Curator/Director of the Alexey von Schlippe Gallery of Art, at the University of Connecticut's Avery Point Campus for the past 18 years. She has taught courses in Studio Art and Art History at UConn for 22 years. Julia has continued her own work as a painter for 35 years, creating large abstract and mixed media & found object paintings as well as working in Encaustic medium. She has been given numerous exhibitions, shown in many art galleries regionally and in New York City, and many commissions, including a mural at the Prudential Center in Boston.

Julia has been a guest curator at other regional galleries including The Lyme Academy, The Slater Memorial Museum, New London Art Society and Gallery, Three Rivers Community College, and Pfizer Corporation's Art Galleries in both New London and Groton, and has been invited to jury several professional art exhibitions as well as regional student exhibitions in Hartford, Essex, Clinton, Guilford, Manchester, New Haven and Norwich Connecticut, and in Rhode Island.

She has also been an invited guest lecturer on the arts for many organizations in our area, on a regular basis, including the Lyman Allyn Museum.

Julia was awarded a month long Residency as a working artist in Bulgaria in 2003 and again in 2005, by the Griffis Foundation of New London and the Orpheus Foundation of Bulgaria, headed by internationally renowned poet, Lyubomir Levchev. There she was given 2 solo exhibitions in 2003 and formed strong liaisons with the arts communities there. One of those exhibitions was at the U.S. Embassy in the Capitol of Sofia. During her second residency, Julia was given exhibitions at the Gallery of Fine Arts in Smolyan and at the Apollo-  
nia International Arts Festival in Sozopol, on the Black Sea.
